# Mt. Edgecumbe Medical Center (MEMC)

## 25 Bed Critical Access Hospital / Family Medicine Lead

- Level IV trauma center and 5 bed ER
- 2 Bed Open ICU
- 2 ORs with 24/7 Gen Surg and Ortho On-Call
- CRNA and Respiratory support
- 3 L&D rooms; 100 deliveries per year
- 24/7 High Risk OB Support
- Procedures: Thoracentesis, Paracentesis, Central /PICC lines, Cardioversions
- Peer Mentorship
- CME / ATLS, CALS, ACLS, ALSO, NRP / POCUS





# **Expanding Substance Use Treatment**

- Rigorous wrap-around medical and behavioral services with daily medication support
- Evidence based treatment that maintains people in sustained treatment longer than other interventions
- Proven to reduce deaths, risk of overdose, HIV, Hepatitis C, unnecessary emergency and hospital visits
- Maximizes patient safety and minimizes diversion
- Helps break the destructive cycle and consequences of opioid addiction
  - Restores family connections
  - Promotes safe and stable housing
  - Supports return to work
  - Provides purpose and direction
  - Reduces crime

# **Opioid Use Disorder Programs**

- Juneau Opened in February 2022
  - Front Street Downtown
  - Front Street Lemon Creek
- Sitka Opened in March 2023
- Klawock Opened in October 2023
- Staffed by Board Certified Addiction Medicine Physician, Addiction and Psychiatric Nurse Practitioners, Pharmacists, Nurses, and Skilled Substance Abuse Counselors, Case Managers, and Support Staff

# Sitka Based Substance Abuse Services

- Supervised, supported recovery-based housing:
  - 20 beds
  - Clean, Safe, Respectful, Therapeutic Environment
  - Up to 16+ weeks of supported housing and active treatment
  - Open to all residents of SE Alaska
  - Program is grounded in an evidence-based approach of psychoeducation and skill building promoting early recovery, relapse prevention, and preparing for long-term recovery.
  - Incorporates nationally recognized Tribal White Bison Curriculum culturally guided process combining power of traditional healing, teaching, and spirituality to support recovery.
  - Offers 34 virtual and face to face group offerings per week 7 days per week focused on building healthy relationships, coping and skill building, understanding thoughts and feelings, and creating pathways toward recovery.
  - All individual and group offerings are available upon return to home community.
