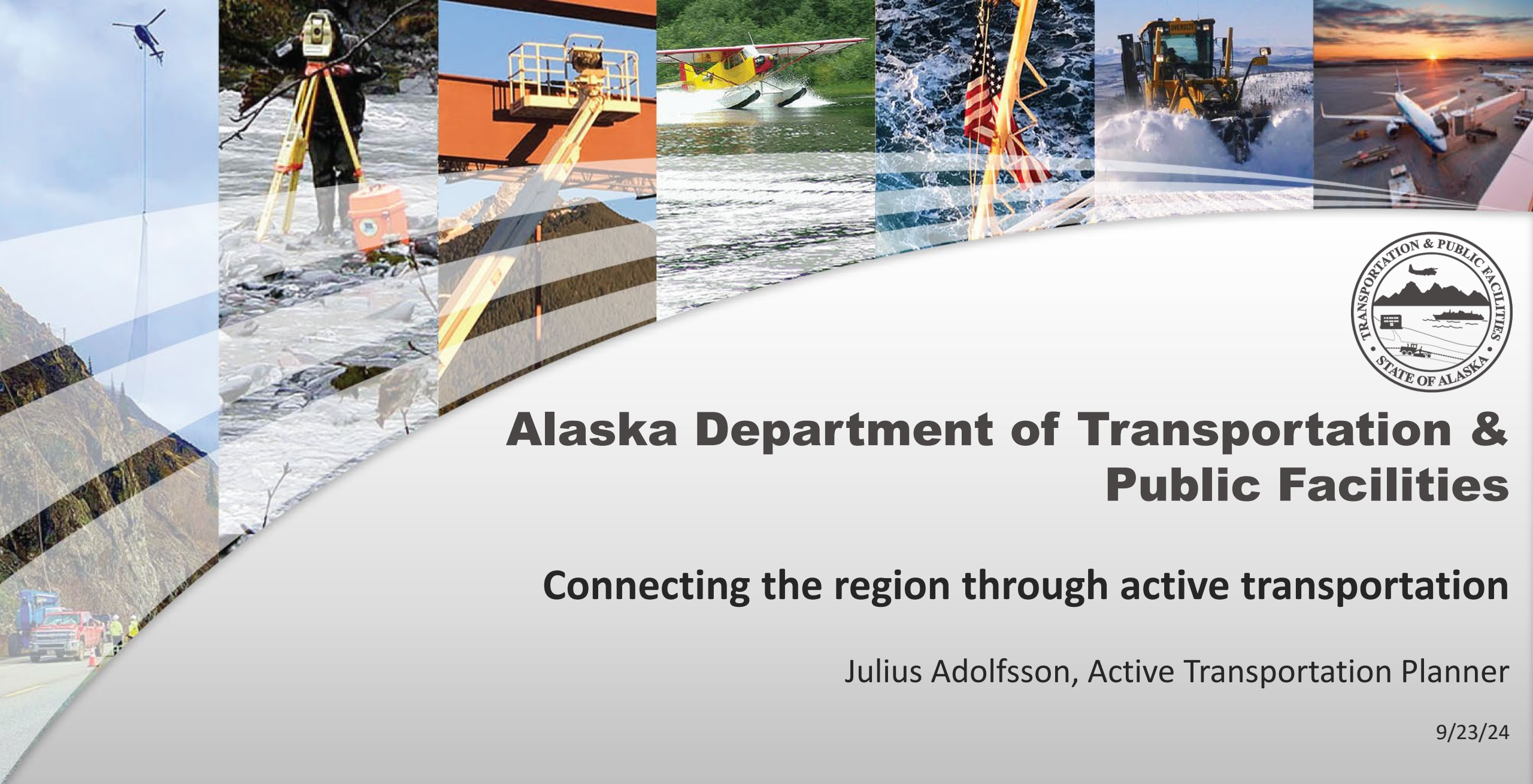

What is active transportation?

- Active transportation is human-powered mobility such as walking, biking, or using an assistive device ([USDOT](#))
- Investing in active transportation has multiple benefits
- Almost 1/3 of Alaskans don't have a driver's license and many more are non-drivers
- **Fun fact:** Nationally, most trips (52%) made are under three miles, which is a short distance perfect for Active Transportation ([USDOT](#))



Connecting the region through active transportation – The United States Bicycle Route System (USBRS)

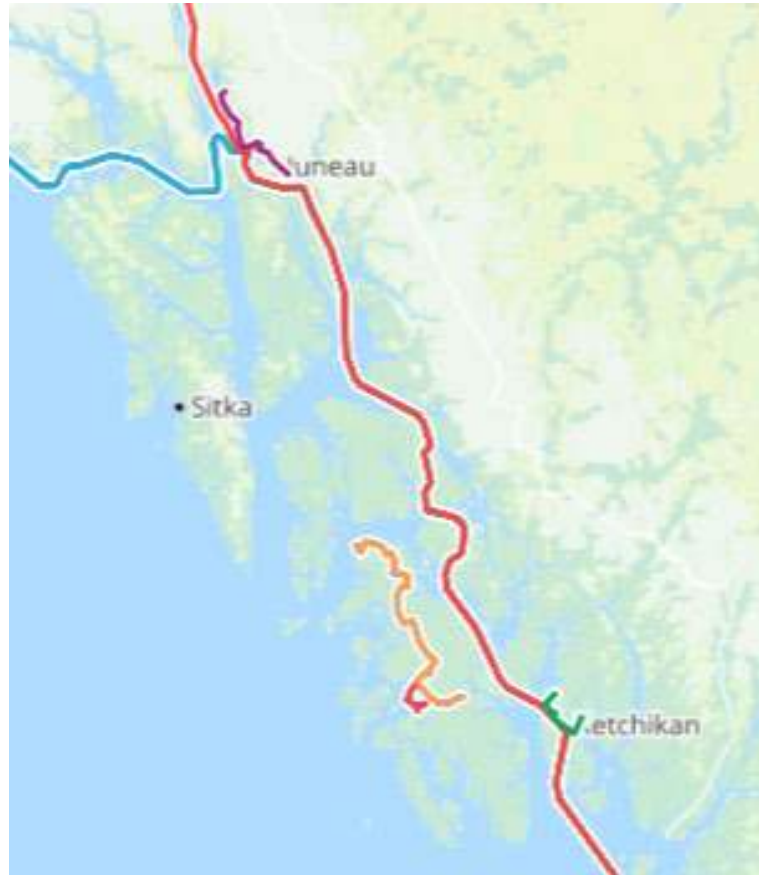
- USBRS national network

- Outreach for community support



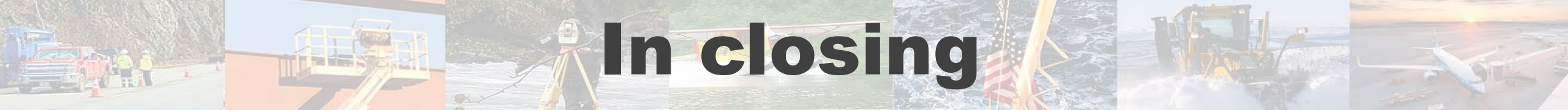
Complete Streets Policy

- Alaska DOT&PF is currently working on developing a statewide Complete Streets Policy
- Complete Streets is a safety approach to planning, designing, constructing, and maintaining surface transportation in a way that is safe, accessible, and comfortable for all types of travelers.
