



Themes

- Road access to increase housing
- Sidewalks & pedestrian safety
- Recreational trail connections
- Match % varies but most seem to be leaning towards min of 9.03%
 - Encouraging additional 1%

Challenges

- Hydroelectric access vs public access
- Shared use paths in State ROW
- Design standards
- Maintenance agreements
- Non-profit sponsors allowed for TAP
